A Message from the Head Teacher

It has been a very busy start to the session. The list of achievements so far this term alone is so long and I am sure you will read about them in more detail throughout this newsletter.

On return in August we were met with continued improving results particularly in senior school. This is extremely encouraging and illustrates the tremendous work done by the staff and the increased ambitions of our young people.

Last month this was further highlighted when an Inspector visited the school. He was specifically looking at the provision for Post 16 pupils in Dundee and we were chosen as a focus school. He commented on the positive ethos within the school, and in the focus groups of pupils, parents and partners it was stated:

Pupils felt well known and cared for. Partners & Parents felt staff were relentless in their efforts to support pupils.

The development of Leadership in our prefects and their specific roles as Sports, Health, Learning & Teaching, Charities and Eco Prefects is becoming more identifiable. The Sports Prefects have helped organise Inter-house competitions, Learning & Teaching Prefects support study opportunities, The Eco Prefects are working with the Eco Group towards an Echo Award for the school and the Charities prefects have been active in promoting Remembrance Day and fund raising through the organisation.

Curricular development continues in S1 with the introduction of an Enterprise course, a Literacy across the Curriculum course and further up the school with Early Education and Childcare. All courses have been well received and the work being done is of the highest standard, developing entrepreneurial skills in young people, an awareness of the world of business, the need for literacy across all things in life and the connection to learning across the curriculum.

The Early Education and Child Care courses have full classes indicating the need to develop vocational options in schools and pupils are responding well in S3 and senior school. This course offers opportunities for pupils to go on into a career in care and the staff creativity has been in abundance as the courses evolve.

Internet Safety - CEOPS/Anti Bullying Message

We are constantly reading about horrific stories where young people are put at risk by predators who use the Internet to contact them and sometimes meet them. This is an unpleasant issue to discuss but one that cannot be ignored. This term, we held assembles for pupils and training for staff. This was to show pupils the dangers of trusting people that you do not know on social networking sites. This has been followed up in Social Education and we have a trained school CEOPS Ambassador in Ms Elspeth Scott (School Librarian). As a result of serious concerns raised by Police and other agencies, I urge you to visit www.thinkyouknow.co.uk and enter the purely for parents section. You can also view the parent's guidance sheets which gives tips and suggestions of how best to look after your child's life online.

In addition we have highlighted to pupils the Anti-Bullying message and the fact that the majority of issues arise out with school and increasingly online.

I would ask that you think carefully about whether you allow unsupervised use by your child of social networking sites, such as Facebook. You may be confident in your child but it is difficult for them to distinguish if a contact is another youngster or not, and they may also feel pressure to join in derogatory comments about others. If you are monitoring this and talking to them about the dangers it may be all the support they need.

Parent Council

The Parent Council started the session by actively taking part in the successful Menzieshill Festival, providing stalls, cake & candy. Over this term the Parent Council have met regularly and the membership has increased. They continue to be very supportive of the school and in particular are focusing on raising funds in order that we can continue to offer Easter School.

We plan to run a Bingo night on Thursday February 2nd, the venue will be confirmed and we hope you will support us by donating any unwanted Christmas gifts as prizes and attend the event. More information from the parent council in January.

Dare Schools' Challenge

In June a team representing Menzieshill High School won the Dare Schools' Challenge, a computer games

programming competition open to all 'Computing Studies' and' Art & Design' pupils from secondary schools in Dundee. The winning team comprising Kieran Banks, Andrew Rae, Callum Fowlie and Steven Ross swept the boards with their peers from throughout the city. Organised by Dundee City Council's Economic Development Department in conjunction with the University of Abertay, the games are judged by a team of academics and computer games programmers. Menzieshill High has taken part in this competition for the last 6 years and the university have acknowledged this, awarding a prize for Computer Software Development at the school's annual prizegiving.



Arnold Clark Challenge

A big "well done" to the two teams of pupils studying Computing from Menzieshill High School, they have been short-listed as top 10 finalists in the Arnold Clark Schools' Challenge. The pupils involved were Michael Doig, James Mann, Daniel Neave, Keiran Banks, Andrew Rae, Curtis Menmuir and Nicholas Leitch.

The teams from Menzieshill High School were two of over seven hundred entries that were selected by Sir



Arnold Clark's judging panel and Chunk Games, who spent days whittling the entries down to just 10 final games.

Sir Arnold Clark, chairman and chief executive of Arnold Clark Automobiles Limited, commented, "We have been absolutely delighted with the overwhelming response to this year's Challenge. With over 700 entries from schools across the length and breadth of Scotland, this year's task to create an idea for a game app was difficult. However the judging team has been surprised by the well thought-out, original ideas created by students at Menzieshill High School. What's more, two entries from this school made it into the top ten!" This is the 2nd year in a row that Menzieshill High School pupils studying Computing have reached the final.



Our Trip to Iceland



During the first week of the summer holidays the Geography department from MHS ran a trip to Iceland with 5 members of staff and 28 pupils taking part. The trip was two years in the planning and pupils worked very hard organising a bingo night to raise money for the trip. The group also like to raise awareness of Fair Trade in the wider school community by regularly hosting a stall at parent's nights and whole school events such as the Menzieshill Festival and the forthcoming Christmas concert.

With more than a hint of Scottish influence on her menu, Chelsea Duncan in S4 had the judges eager to sample her Balmoral Chicken and Creamy Chowder – in fact they were so impressed that they left with enough for their supper.

The Rotarians commended the pupils for their inventiveness and flavours and struggled with the decision of the school heat winners. In the end and after re-tasting everyone's food in the call of duty (!) they eventually selected two pupils to qualify for the school heats in the next round in January.

Hannah Klepplang in S4 qualified with her Home Made Spring Rolls and Ginger Dipping Sauce as a starter to her main Singapore Style Pork Noodles which had more than a kick of spice to it. Mehnaz Asad in S3 also qualified, working calmly and with poise to produce home-made Vegetable Samosas followed by the most fragrant Lamb Biryani.

We wish both girls success as they go through to the next round where they will produce a 3 course meal to try and beat off the competition for the prize of attending a cookery school in Italy and the coveted Young Chef of the Year title.

Engineering Development Trust

Five students within S2 (Sam Barclay, Niamh Brunton, Michelle Burnage, Bradley Evans, Ewan Kelly) have worked on an Engineering Development Trust (EDT) programme over the last 10 weeks that has required them to research into the use of a Biomass Power Generator as a source of electricity and heat within Menzieshill High School and its local community. Harry Maliff from Albacom Ltd, an Engineering company within Dundee, has worked with these students and has given to them an excellent insight into life as an engineer within the city. The group has also been supported by Mr Squair within the Mathematics Department. The students will make a formal presentation of their findings to EDT in January 2012.

Maths in the Pipeline

Omar Asad, Craig Mays, Fiona McArtney, Martyn McCabe and Graeme Nicoll represented the Mathematics Department at the Bonar Hall, on Friday 30th September, when S5/6 Higher students from across Dundee and the Angus region met to participate and then compete in an event entitled 'Maths in the Pipeline'. Our students were placed into teams of 4 students that worked together on problems that contextualised Mathematics within the modern oil industry. Each team was then given an Oil-Business Challenge in the afternoon and had to report their findings back to a team of experts at the end of the day. Mr Harkins attended the event and witnessed each of our students make a valuable contribution to their own team's success. This was particularly true for Craig, whose team won the event as a consequence of his excellent and confident delivery to his audience at the end of the event.

Mathematics and the Police

Ms Jelly invited Jen Keenan from the Dundee Police Department to the school on 15th December to enable Ms Keenan to speak to her S3 class on the use of Mathematics within the Police Force. Here is a review of the percussion ensemble's performance at Dundee University Chaplaincy: Dundee schools nowadays seem to be able to produce a fascinating range of musical groups. For this Friday's lunchtime concert at the University Chaplaincy, it was the turn of Menzieshill High School to let us hear the half dozen members of its Percussion Ensemble at work.

I don't know about you, but in my ignorance I rather feared this might consist of a horde of enthusiastic but undisciplined youngsters banging away at anything that came in sight or reach. Not a bit of it though. These were thoroughly mature students, mainly in third and fourth years.

The instruments they had before them were an array of marimbas and xylophones. If you think the percussion section of an orchestra is rightly described as the kitchen department, then this was going to be cuisine of a sophisticated kind.

The programme ranged from original compositions of a modern stamp (not literally, of course) to generally sensitive arrangements of classics from the eighteenth century, by Clementi and Bach. The programme had plenty of variety, mixing solos with group items. It was also good to see that director Kenny Carlyle, as well as schooling the players, provided them with some music, both an original composition and a transcription. The big solo on marimba, Mitchell Peters's Yellow after the Rain, revealed the range of subtlety of which Ian Christie is now capable. An earlier solo, Cossack Capers, showed varied and witty use of the xylophone by a younger player. As well as their group pieces, the players showed their rhythmic control with just their hands, and to stirring effect, in Steve Reich's Clapping Music.




Physical Education Department
