Menzieshill High School Modern Studies Department

S1 – Social Subjects

As well as traditional discrete subject learning, the Geography, History and Modern Studies departments combined to give pupils a wider learning experience:

- a. Interdisciplinary Learning Experience In January, pupils took part in a series of learning activities with a focus on Dundee: 'Dundee's environment', 'Dundee's history' and 'life and employment in Dundee today'. Working in pairs over three weeks, the pupils produced a booklet of information. Pupils were then asked to make connections in their learning across the three Social Subjects.
- b. 'Rich Task' In May, and with the support of the Ranger Service at Camperdown Park, pupils completed a number of activities in relation to the environment, history and work in the park. This was followed by an afternoon of health promoting activities.

S1/2 – Modern Studies

British Red Cross – Gill Moffat from the British Red Cross visited the department in April. Combining two of the four S1 classes, Gill led a series of active learning activities that involved pupils in a number of activities with human rights as the focus.

Quiz – Eight S1 pupils took part in the annual Dundee Modern Studies Quiz. Organised by Dundee MSA and with the support of the city council, this event has been running for a number of years.

S3

Harry McLevy Award – Congratulations to Molly Fowlie who was the school-based **and** Dundee City winner of the 2012 Harry McLevy Award. The annual researchbased competition saw Molly investigate the debate surrounding the means-testing of Child Benefit. Molly collected a certificate and a cheque to the value of £70.

MSET S3 Ppt. Competition – Molly Fowlie (she's having a good year) was one of six national award winners in a Powerpoint Competition. Based on the theme of the methods used by candidates to get elected, Molly's presentation was judged to be 'accurate, informative and well produced'. Molly collected a certificate and a cheque for £20.



Scottish Parliament – 28 S3 pupils visited the Scottish Parliament in March. After a tour of the building, the pupils then had the chance to meet and speak with local MSP Joe Fitzpatrick and regional MSP Mark McDonald. The visit finished with pupils sitting in the public gallery where Deputy First Minister Nicola Sturgeon delivered a statement on health on behalf of the Scottish government. Thanks to Joe and Mark and their respective parliamentary assistants for their support and cooperation.

S4

Power Point Competition – Josh Bachelor and Ross Irvine represented Menzieshill HS in the annual Powerpoint Challenge which is hosted by Claverhouse Training and organised by Dundee MSA. The boys put on a great show and came a close second to the overall citywide winner. Thanks to Claverhouse Training and in particular Chief Executive Alistair Cameron.

S5/6

Higher Pupil Conference – For 2012, the annual Modern Studies Higher Pupil Conference was hosted by Menzieshill HS. Around 170 pupils studying Higher MS from across the city had the chance to take part in a

number of activities that were aimed at raising attainment. Thanks to Dundee MSA for organising and Dundee City Council and Claverhouse Training for their support.

Jim McGovern MP visited the department in January. This was a follow-up to the Houses of Parliament visit by S5/6 in September. After a short introduction on his background and experience as an MP, Jim then went 'open to question' fielding questions on a number of issues raised by pupils including the independence debate, child benefit proposals and youth unemployment. Class teacher, Mr Rew, was particularly impressed by Terri-Louise Weir in 4TA1 who bravely volunteered to be the first student to try the online assessment and then went on to attain a mark of 100% in her 'Money Management' unit of work.



Money Week (Monday 5th to Friday 9th March)

A wide variety of topics related to 'Money' were taught throughout the school during the school's Money Week in March. Of these, the Music department investigated the amount of money lost to record companies as a consequence of 'pirate-downloads', replica bank-notes were created by students within the Art department and the more pressing matter of financial cut-backs within both national and local government were studied by students within the Modern Studies department.

S4 MoneySense Enterprise Event

The Mathematics department brought all S4 students together on the afternoon of Wednesday 30th May and asked them to simulate the organisation of a formal dinner for 100 top executives at a Royal Bank of Scotland event within Edinburgh. Students were split into groups of four and asked to take on the responsibilities of Project Manager, Catering Consultant, Finance Officer and Marketing Executive. A fantastic afternoon of cross-curricular activity then took place that required each team to work together closely to achieve their goal. Menus had to be researched, the total cost for the event had to be worked out, a company logo and business card



had to be designed and a company letter had to be written to the client advising them that a tender was being placed for the contract. Many congratulations go to Amanda Leitch, Rachel Jackson, Maria Boath and Lauder Simpson within 'Team 9' for their winning entry.



Menzieshill High School Learning Resource Centre

It has been a busy year in the library with regular visits from the Mathematics, Science, Geography, History, Modern Studies, English and Modern Languages department among others. The LRC is also well used outside class time for a variety of purposes ranging from homework to reading to playing (educational) computer games.

Some of our keen readers have been involved in book testing for the Red House Book Award. This gives them the chance to read brand new books from publishers, comment on them and vote for their favourites in the only book award which is decided entirely by children. This year's overall winner was A Monster Calls, by Patrick Ness. Interestingly, this book has also just won not only this year's Carnegie medal for the best children's book, but also the Greenaway medal for the best illustrations.





We have been extremely lucky this session in having visits from three authors. In November, Sue Reid Sexton, the author of Mavis's Shoe, came for two sessions with the top two S2 English classes when she did creative writing workshops with them.

In January Dundee Public Library arranged for us to have a visit from Alex Scarrow, the author of the Time Riders series of books who did a high-octane session with the whole of S2 and caused a lot of interest in the concept of time-travel and changing the course of history.

Keith Gray has been a popular visitor to the school in the past, and we were lucky enough to have another visit from him in April when he spoke to the whole of S1 as part of their Literacy Across Learning course. He was funny and engaging as well as though provoking, and the pupils thoroughly enjoyed his visit – borrowing of his books went up significantly afterwards.





Menzieshill High School Geography Department

As part of the new Curriculum for Excellence Geography course all S1 pupils have been learning about Dundee and Development! In this topic pupils have been comparing levels of development between Dundee and contrasting places such as Bangladesh. They have also been learning about Fair Trade and how it helps to improve the lives of others in poorer communities across the world. Pupils participated in a peer assessment poster activity showing the benefits Fair Trade brings to such communities, some wonderful posters were produced! Earlier in the session S1 pupils were also involved in an interdisciplinary project which incorporated elements of all 3 Social Subjects. The project involved pupils



working in pairs to produce a booklet called 'Discover Dundee', involving research into Dundee's history, living and working in Dundee and Dundee's Waterfront Project.



In S2 Geography, as part of the new Curriculum for Excellence course, pupils have been learning very useful map skills ______ and have put these map

have been learning very useful map skills skills into practice for the 'CSI MHS' group task. Pupils were presented the problem of a suspect escaping from prison and had to work in teams to identify, on a map, the route they thought the suspect took. They then had to present their findings in a police report – all in

a day's work in the Geography department at MHS! In the latter part of the session S2 pupils were learning all about earthquakes and volcanoes with a particular focus on the 2011 Japan disaster. S2 pupils used their writing and presenting skills to produce a BBC news reports on Japan one year on from the disaster, some future news readers amongst us indeed!!





Menzieshill High School Fair Trade Group

The Fair Trade group at Menzieshill High School continue to work hard to promote Fair Trade and the benefits it brings, both within the school and the wider school community. The group continues to meet every Wednesday in the schools Learning Resource Centre and they run a stall every Friday selling products to students and staff. As well as running a stall once a week in school the Fair Trade group also have a stall present at parents nights and other events such as; the Menzieshill Festival, the Christmas Concert, Miss O Neill's fundraising Zumbathon and the Summer Concert.

Also, to celebrate and promote Fair Trade Fortnight this session, the group organised two main activities to be carried out throughout the school. The first activity was planned so the whole school could be involved. The group put together packs of resources for teachers to use with their tutor groups during school tutor time. The resources included a Fair Trade quiz and footstep templates for pupils to complete to show that they are 'making a step' towards Fair trade. The other big activity that took place in school during Fair Trade Fortnight was a 'Big Brew' coffee morning in the LRC on Friday 2nd March. Staff and S6 pupils attended and the 'Big Brew' was a great success raising £101.49.

As well as promoting and supporting fair Trade the group were also responsible for organising a 'Rag Bag' collection in the school. Altogether the group collected 113 kg of materials from staff throughout the session and this raised £65 altogether. Therefore in total between the 'Rag Bag' collection and the 'Big Brew' coffee the group raised £169.49 which was donated to the 'Mighty Meals Project'. The group continue to work hard and work towards achieving the Fair Trade Schools Award with hope of achieving this in the near future.

The festival was a huge success with 7 feeder primary schools involved (Hillside, Gowriehill, Lochee, Charleston, St. Clements, Longforgan & Inchture). We had over 150 pupils involved and they all had a great time.

The History department has again enjoyed a busy and successful year. Mr McDonald presented a fantastic assembly to all pupils as part of Holocaust Memorial Week which always leads up to 27 of January, the anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz concentration camp by Soviet troops. Pupils were encouraged to think about the issue of human rights and the abuses that took place during the Holocaust. The assembly also gave pupils the opportunity to think about how we as individuals and as a society can defend our human rights and speak out for those who have their rights ignored.

In support of their studies on the First World War, S4 took part in a presentation by the Black Watch museum during which they were able to dress up in officers' and regulars' uniforms and handle weaponry. The History department was delighted to be able to offer pupils a number of trips this year. S2 pupils, who have been studying the Wars of Independence, visited the Wallace Monument and Bannockburn giving them the opportunity to put their knowledge of one of Scotland's key historical events into context. It was an excellent day out enjoyed by all; the highlight was definitely Mr Bruce and Mr McDonald leading their second years into battle in our own re-enactment of events!

Finally, pupils from S4, S5 and S6 have recently returned from a Tour of the First World War Battlefields. They visited the scenes of carnage at Ypres and the Somme. Pupils were able to gain first-hand experience of trench life at Hill 60, one of the few areas in Belgium where trenches have been preserved. They were also able to visit monuments to the dead of both sides at Thiepval and Langemark. A highlight of the trip was the visit to Loos which is, of course, of particular significance to Dundonians. On September 25, 1915, the 8th and 9th Battalions of The Black Watch, together with men of the 4th and 5th Battalions, known as the Dundee Pals' Battalion, went into action shortly before dawn. Hundreds of Dundee's sons were sacrificed that day and our pupils felt extremely privileged to have had the opportunity to visit this important site and pay their respects to the fallen. The trip finished off at the Menin Gate in Ypres where pupils participated in the Last Post Ceremony which is held every day at 8pm by the local Fire Brigade; a simple but moving tribute to the courage and self-sacrifice of those who fell in defence of the town. The History department is extremely proud to be able to offer our pupils this thought provoking and enriching experience which we hope they will never forget.

At the beginning of last session, five of our senior pupils; Omar Asad, Callum Fowlie, Graeme Nicol, Keiran Cartmill and Craig Mays, made it through the first rounds of the Abertay

> Eggheads Quiz, to face the Scientists. To end this session, four of our S1 pupils; Jamie Savage, Holly Keith, Calum Blair and Jade Heron, took part in the Salters Science festival at Dundee University,

> > placing 3rd in the challenge against competition from schools within Dundee,

Angus and Aberdeenshire.

Our younger learners have now experienced

their second year of the new CfE curriculum and appear to be engaging well into all aspects. They involve themselves wholeheartedly into given tasks,

allowing their imagination to express themselves, whether through 3D models of matter or renewable energy supplied islands, to building and firing

their rockets at the end of the Universe topic, (on a very sunny day in March, known as our summer), or through colourful posters and PowerPoint presentations.

To extend their experience in Science pupils we were lucky to receive several visits over the year. The Scifun Roadshow in Feb allowed the 2nd years (and senior assistants), an opportunity to appreciate different branches of Science, on top of this we had visits from University of Abertay, looking at more body based Science and from Robert Gordons University in May to run an electronics workshop with S3 Physics.



Menzieshill High School Design and Technology Department

An on going group within the Design and Technology Department is the ROV group. Last year the ROV team made it to the international competition in the Neutral Buoyancy Lab in NASA, Houston, Texas. This year during the regional competition the group came 2nd overall. This is an excellent achievement and we are all very proud of our young members. The team is already thinking of new ideas for next year.



Also this year, the Design and Technology Department was

very lucky in getting funding for a Denford VLS Laser Cutter. The Laser Cutter will assist the department in progressing with CFE and already pupils have had the opportunity to use the Laser Cutter to make various projects. In the coming year we hope to have a group of young pupils trained fully in its use. This will allow them to

create complex models and to teach other young pupils how to use it.

The Denford Laser Cutter can transform images or drawings on your computer screen into real items made from a wide variety of materials. These Lasers are ideal for cutting, deep engraving, precision scribing, decorative etching on wood, plastic, fabric, leather, paper, rubber and will also mark glass, ceramic, metal and stone.

The Design & Technology Department is continuing to bring in new equipment to help pupils gain vital skills for working life. We hope to help every pupil understand the importance of technology throughout life and how this will help them in the present and the future.



Menzieshill High School Literacy Across Learning

Our new S1 Literacy Across Learning course has continued to be very successful. In term three we were developing research skills using the DISCOVER model, and applying them to a Dundee project which linked with the work being done in Social Subjects. Each class worked on a different theme:

1LAL1 on Jam, with the Home Economics Department; 1LAL2 on Weather with Geography; 1LAL3 on Whales and whaling with History; 1LAL4 on Journalism; 1LAL5 on Jute with the Art department and 1LAL6 on Antarctica with the Science Department.

This course has created national interest. We have been featured in the Times Educational Supplement Scotland, had visitors from Education Scotland and other authorities and been asked to speak at conferences.
